INTRODUCTION TO THE NEXT DOOR

OUR MISSION:

We provide a continuum of evidence-based substance abuse and mental health services for women in an environment of faith and healing to restore hope and a lifetime of recovery.

SERVICES OFFERED:



INPATIENT TREATMENT

It is important for women to detox and start their recovery journey in a safe environment physically, emotionally, mentally, and spiritually. We offer both Medically Monitored Detox and **Residential Treatment** for women struggling with alcohol or drug addiction. Our 28-day program explores the underlying issues of mind, body, and spirit that are associated with substance use disorders, co-occurring mental illness. and trauma.

OUTPATIENT TREATMENT

The Next Door's outpatient services allow women to participate in intensive treatment during the day and practice recovery in their everyday life. This provides clients the chance to discuss relapse triggers as they occur and develop coping skills to combat them. After clients step down from inpatient treatment, our outpatient programs provide continued counseling, peer support, medication management or other services.

RE-ENTRY SERVICES

Our purpose is to assist our clients to successfully transition from incarceration back into the community. The Next Door's Correctional **Release Center (CRC)** serves 42 adult women who are currently incarcerated and finishing the last 6-24 months of their sentence. CRC offers an array of services to provide a holistic approach to meet our clients' needs throughout their transition process.

WHAT MAKES US UNIQUE:

DUAL-DIAGNOSIS

We understand each woman has a unique set of needs, so our expert staff work closely with clients to provide comprehensive care to treat both substance use and mental health disorders simultaneously.

FAITH-BASED

We want our clients to know that they are created in the image of God and deeply loved by God. We meet women wherever they are spiritually, modeling God's love for them through our words and actions.

FEMALE ONLY

Women have gender-specific needs and goals when participating in addiction treatment. Female-only treatment addresses these needs to ensure women receive the most comprehensive treatment possible in a safe and supportive setting.

PREGNANT WOMEN

The Next Door is committed to walking alongside pregnant women struggling with addiction. TND is one of the only facilities in the southeast that accepts women up to 38 weeks in gestation in all levels of care.

ADDICTION TREATMENT OVERVIEW

PROGRAMMING:

The Next Door uses a treatment model that integrates 12 step recovery, faith, and evidence-based practices to address the needs of the whole woman – mind, body, and spirit. Our staff are highly trained in their respective areas, surrounding a woman with a team of experts who are equipped to meet her unique needs.

We offer care from Medically Monitored Detox, Residential Inpatient, Partial Hospitalization Program (PHP), Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP), through ongoing Aftercare Services.

GRADUATES:



In 2022, we transitioned our Residential Inpatient length to a set **28 DAY** program. Length of care makes a huge difference in achieving lifetime recovery. Therefore, each woman now stays for a full 28 days - regardless of insurance reimbursement.

This year, we revised our **THERAPEUTIC CURRICULUM** each week focused on the following topics through all touch-points with a client: mindfulness, interpersonal effectiveness, emotional regulation, and distress tolerance.

In order to best serve our clients, our residential therapists began conducting each clients' **INTAKE SESSION**. This transition helps clients build trust with their individual therapist and establish a sense of community from their first day at TND.

CAREDFOR APP:

We recommend all discharging clients download our free app, CaredFor, where they can connect with other TND alumni, get support, celebrate milestones, and stay inspired in their recovery.

This app is our own exclusive social media channel specifically for recovery-based support – allowing clients to connect with their recovery family. It also connects alumni to our CPRS team for ongoing one-on-one support, advice and encouragement.

EVENTS AND OUTREACH

Insurance reimbursements cover an average of 47% of the actual cost of treatment at The Next Door. That disparity requires us to make up the remaining difference through fundraising in order to continue serving our community with quality treatment services.
